




### **Injuries by Body Part**




### **Nature of Injuries**

# Leading & Lagging Indicators

#### Definition:

Lagging indicators measure the end result of OHS processes, policies and procedures. They're a record of things that have already happened. Since they record things after the fact, they inform a reactive health and safety culture.




#### Definition:

Leading indicators focus on future health and safety performance with the intent of continuous improvement. They are a signal and monitor of what is being done on an ongoing basis to prevent worker illness and injury.

**Enforcement Strategies** 



#### **WSH Enforcement Strategies**

All of WSH's enforcement strategies will continue to reflect the following priority areas of focus:

- workplaces that demonstrate repeated or willful noncompliance to high hazard contraventions
- high risk workplaces, with emphasis on those with high or increasing injury and illness rates
- workplaces that fail to notify WSH of serious incidents
- workplaces that employ vulnerable workers
- workplaces associated with high risk hazardous substances or health hazards

### **Manufacturing SWOs 2017**

- End of Q3 there were 20 Stop Work Orders issued for:
  - Serious Incidents: Machinery/Equipment Inspections
  - Guarding
  - Asbestos
  - Chemical & Biological Substances
  - Cranes & Hoists Rigging
  - Welding and Allied Processes

# Safety and health certification

- Benchmark for safety and health performance
- Focused on reducing workplace injuries and illnesses
- Promotes a culture of safety







#### **Prevention Rebate Program**

- Launch Date: Q1, 2018
- Maintain Certification for 12 months, and meet all eligibility criteria.
- Employers must have reported their actual payroll, and their total hours worked to the WCB.

#### **Prevention Rebate Program**

- Rebate will be the greater of 15 per cent of their premium or \$3,000 to a maximum of 75 per cent of their assessment premium.


