





Injuries by Body Part

Injuries by Body Part Group




Nature of Injuries

Safety and health certification

- Benchmark for safety and health performance
- Focused on reducing workplace injuries and illnesses
- Promotes a culture of safety



Prevention Rebate Criteria

- Maintain Certification for 12 months, and meet all eligibility criteria.
- Employers must have reported their actual payroll, and their **total hours worked** to the WCB.


